- 4. Present the basic thematic and morphological characteristics of Palamas and Sikelianos' poetry as the major lyrical tradition.
- 5. Discern the basic stages of evolution of Palamas and Sikelianos' poetry and analyze its themes and its versification.
- 6. Present the ways in which Palamas heritage has been utilized by Sikelianos focusing not only on the similarities but also on the essential differences between them.
- 7. Present Palamas and Sikelianos' reception by criticism and by their followers (post-war and contemporary poets).
